The first bills for the water system were presented to the Board for their approval. 28% of Division D is now completed. Mr. Gary Siders informed the Board that the yards and roads which are now torn up due to the digging for the water pipe will be corrected and property restored to its original shape.

Jimmy James was approved as the new town deputy and Wm. Mc Knight resignation was accepted effective June 15, 1977. The police were requested to keep a log of all hours and activity since there is no base station for them. This is for the protection also.

It was requested that Chuck Dull begin his regular duties as the Town Marshall earlier then he has in the past. The police were asked to crack down on speeders and mischeif makers. Also they are to check the public beach more frequently as there has been some problem down there with people pulling out poles, drinking and other unfavorable activity. The Enco Station is to place a sign on the property "No lottering", after this is done, then the police can take some sort of action to control the people and cars that are at the Enco Station after hours.

Mr. Sanders was requesting that the easement be colsed between his two houses. Brad Thomas told Zip Sanders that he would have to go thru the Steuben County Planning Commission with his problem and request them to take the action he desired.

There being no further business, the Board closed its regular meeting at 8:45 p.m., June 6, 1977.
