(3) Town Sanitary Landfill. Ainsworth Sewell commented on the trash left on the hill by Steve Swift. Trustee Paul Headley then called Paul S. Swift on the phone and asked that he come to the meeting. After he arrived and was asked about the situation he agreed to use his equipment to shove it over and start a cliff. He also stated that he would bring in gravel so that when winter comes Bill Sewell and others can get their vehicles into the Dump.

(4) Jake Fifer. It was suggested that the Town pay Mr Fifer the sum of \$5.00 to help defray the cost of gasoline used in keeping the grass mowed by Mr Fifer for the Town. Since the suggestion was agreed to by all the Trustees the Clerk-Treasurer was instructed to prepare a Warrant for same.

(5) Calendar Year 1972 Tax Rate - Hamilton Corporation. The tax rate for Hamilton Corporation will be the same as for 1971. This was possible due to increased property valuations and excise taxes.

(6) Law Enforcement Activities. Paul Headley stated he had talked at length with Mr Ronnie DeWayne Deetz about the possibility of assuming reemployment as Town Marshal. He stated that Mr Deetz had agreed to do the job for a monthly salary of \$250.00. After some discussion by the Trustees it was decided to terminate the employment of Mr David Goodwin effective immediately, and that Trustee Lyle Sutton was to meet with Mr Deetz and discuss the proposed reemployment and, if satisfactory to Trustee Sutton he was to hire him and have him sworn in as Town Marshal at a salary of \$250 00 per month effective immediately.

(7) Christmas Street Decorations. A motion was made by Paul Headley, seconded by Walter Heller and carried that the Town of Hamilton pay up to \$250.00 for labor in putting up and taking down Christmas decorations.

(8) Signing of Claims. Claims presented were reviewed and discussed. Warrants were ordered drawn in payment of claims that were approved.

(9) Offer to Purchase Truck. Johnson & Swift, Inc offered to sell the Town of Hamilton at a cost of \$1,000.00 a 1963 International Harvester Dump Truck, 5 speed, 345 cu in V-8 Engine, with a 4 Yard Box. The offer was taken under advisement.

Reading of the Minutes

Minutes of the meeting of October 4, 1971 were read by the Clerk-Treasurer. There being no additions or corrections the Minutes stood as read.

Old Business:

(1) Wolverine Insurance Company. Reference Minutes of September and October 1971 meetings. A representative of the Company was in Hamilton during October and talked with Trustee Paul Headley. Plans for a new Fire Station/Town Hall were covered at length. The representative stated that he would return in a couple of months to follow up.

(2) Intersection of State Road 427 & Bellefountain Road. The Clerk-Treasurer has just been informed that a Mr Almo Stucky of the Indiana State Highway Traffic Department in Fort Wayne (1517 Catalpa Street) should be contacted to request a 4-Way Stop at subject intersection.

(3) Request For Gravel. Discussion was held about the need for gravel alongside Bellefountain Road in front of the Max Baker residence. It was decided to have Gnagy Gravel supply the gravel.

New Business
